Behold My Servant

The term of servant is not a term we readily use to describe our Lord but this is exactly how He describes himself in Mark 10:45 “For even the Son of man came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, and to give his life a ransom for many.” The prophet Isaiah speaks of this servant in what are known as the Servant Songs which are found in chapters 42:1-9, 49:1-13, 50:4-11, and 52:13-53:12. These passages are rightly applied to our Savior Jesus Christ for He is the fulfillment of these passages as is readily seen in the reading of these texts and then seeing their fulfillment in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. For the sake of this article we will look at the first passage.

Isaiah 42:1-9 “Behold my servant, whom I uphold; mine elect, in whom my soul delighteth; I have put my spirit upon him: he shall bring forth judgment to the Gentiles. He shall not cry, nor lift up, nor cause his voice to be heard in the street. A bruised reed shall he not break, and the smoking flax shall he not quench: he shall bring forth judgment unto truth. He shall not fail nor be discouraged, till he have set judgment in the earth: and the isles shall wait for his law. Thus saith God the LORD, he that created the heavens, and stretched them out; he that spread forth the earth, and that which cometh out of it; he that giveth breath unto the people upon it, and spirit to them that walk therein: I the LORD have called thee in righteousness, and will hold thine hand, and will keep thee, and give thee for a covenant of the people, for a light of the Gentiles; To open the blind eyes, to bring out the prisoners from the prison, and them that sit in darkness out of the prison house. I am the LORD: that is my name: and my glory will I not give to another, neither my praise to graven images. Behold, the former things are come to pass, and new things do I declare: before they spring forth I tell you of them.”

The gospel of Matthew speaks of this text being fulfilled in Jesus: Matthew 12:16-21 “And (Jesus) charged them that they should not make him known: That it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Esaias the prophet, saying, Behold my servant, whom

I have chosen; my beloved, in whom my soul is well pleased: I will put my spirit upon him, and he shall shew judgment to the Gentiles. He shall not strive, nor cry; neither shall any man hear his voice in the streets. A bruised reed shall he not break, and smoking flax shall he not quench, till he send forth judgment unto victory. And in his name shall the Gentiles trust.” In this context Jesus had just healed a man with a withered hand and though the Pharisees were enraged because He did this on the Sabbath, nevertheless great crowds followed him and he healed them all. Jesus over and over demonstrated himself as a compassionate servant of the people he ministered to. He healed the blind, the lame, the deaf, and all kinds of other diseases that were plaguing the people. He indeed ministered to the needs of the people rather than them ministering to him. This is the Servant who is chosen of God to judge His people. His judgment though is not a condemning sentence unto death but rather a deliverance from death unto life because He comes to give His life as a ransom for many. The prophet Isaiah records the servant songs for us to see the graciousness of our God. The ancient Israelites needed hope in the midst of their trials and struggles, someone to look to for help and deliverance. “Behold my servant” then becomes a beacon of hope for them as well as us because He has come to restore the bruised reed not destroy it. He has come to fan into flames the smoking flax or the faintly burning wick rather than to snuff it out. The Servant who is Jesus came to establish salvation for the Jews and the Gentiles. He who was in the beginning with God and by whom all things were made and without Him was not anything made that was made became a servant to all that He might bring us unto Himself. We, who were dead in our trespasses and sins. To us this Servant came who would become the Suffering Servant to take our sins upon Himself so that we could be declared righteous. 2 Corinthians 5:21 “For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him.” This is the judgment unto truth or victory. *continued on next page.*

This is the justice that God brings upon the human race. We who deserved only condemnation and punishment receive instead acquittal and reward. This only a gracious God can give, a God who loves His people and in His care for them offers His grace and forgiveness through the work of His Servant.

This passage finally speaks to us of the new covenant established by this servant. The new covenant which the prophet Jeremiah spoke of as well and the Hebrew writer quoted: Hebrews 8:11-12 *"And they shall not teach every man his neighbour, and every man his brother, saying, Know the Lord: for all shall know me, from the least to the greatest. For I will be merciful to their unrighteousness, and their sins and their iniquities will I remember no more."* This servant makes all of this a reality for us. He takes that which is old and fulfills it and establishes the new which declares to you and me that we are forgiven and all is well. So this new year let us continue to "Behold the Servant". Continue to look to Jesus who indeed is the author and finisher of our faith.

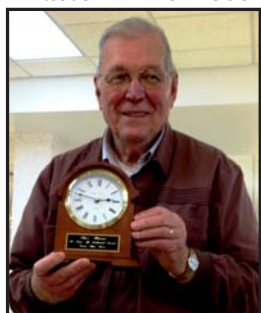

Funeral



James Edward Yliniemi, age 76, of Frazee, MN, passed away on Sunday, December 8, 2013, at Sanford Health in Fargo, ND.

James was born on November 10, 1937 on the family farm in Toad Lake Township, Becker Co., MN to Isacki (Ike) and Aili Yliniemi. He graduated from Frazee High School with

the class of 1956. After graduation James moved to Minneapolis, MN where he began working for Honeywell as a machinist. He was drafted into the Army in 1958 and was stationed in Guam where he rose to the rank of E-4. Upon his honorable discharge, he returned to Minneapolis where he resumed his career with Honeywell. James was united in marriage to Marie Taskey on January 14, 1961. This union was blessed with four children: Cindy, Joy, Roger and Joe. He made his home in the Osage/Snellman area. James and Marie were divorced in 1977. In addition to farming, James worked as a mail carrier for the U.S. Postal Service and owned and operated the Snellman Store. He was also a skilled carpenter and could be found in his workshop most days crafting beautiful custom cabinets.

James was an active member of Spruce Grove Apostolic Lutheran Church in Wolf Lake. He was also a member of the Finnish American Historical Society and served as the chairman of Wolf Lake Township and Fire Warden for over 20 years. Family was extremely important to James and he met with all his brothers and sisters every Sunday for lunch without fail. Above all, he loved his children and grandchildren and always looked forward to their visits.

He is survived by his four children: Cindy Hart of Park Rapids, Joy (Gene) Kraushaar of Park Rapids, Roger (Robyn) Yliniemi of West Fargo, ND, and Joe (Lisa) Yliniemi of Phoenix, AZ; 6 siblings: Roy Yliniemi of Fergus Falls, MN, Helen Laine of Detroit Lakes, MN, Elmer (Miriam) Yliniemi of Frazee, MN, Hazel Yliniemi of Frazee, MN, Hulda (Bruce) Sannes of Frazee, MN and Patricia (Arlan) Ervasti of Bertha, MN; 11 grandchildren: Ryan, Heather, Jessica, Hannah, Sara, Shelby, A.J., Britney, Cole, Conner and Logan; 8 great-grandchildren: Haillee, Evan, Colin, Brayden, Mercadees, Brooklin, Whitney and Mary; 3 step-grandchildren: Ashley, Kim and Nick; as well as numerous nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.
